
Intermittent self-catheterisation (ISC) step-by-step instructions for men

1. Choose a place in your home suitable for administration. It needs to be comfortable and have enough clean surfaces within easy reach.




8. Hold the penis straight and upwards to your tummy with your non-dominant hand.


Slowly insert the catheter into the urethra (the hole at the end of the penis). When urine starts to flow, push the catheter a little further in.



9. Return the penis to its normal position to allow the urine to flow through the catheter.




10. Once the urine flow has stopped and the bladder is empty you're ready to instill your iAluRil[®].




13. Once all of the iAluRil[®] has been instilled into the bladder, slowly remove the catheter with the syringe still attached and dispose of as instructed.

Keep iAluRil[®] in the bladder for between 30 minutes and 3 hours.



12. Slowly instill the contents of the syringe through the catheter by pushing gently on the plunger with your forefinger.



14. Clean your hands.

15. Complete the relevant documentation to keep a record of your instillation for your doctor or nurse.
